

INTERESTED IN LEARNING WHAT TREES GROW IN PALO ALTO? Want to get to know the city a little better? Looking for the perfect tree for your yard? Canopy has the perfect solution for you! We have developed a series of 12 Tree Walks which take you around various sections of the city. Each tree walk has been developed by a certified arborist and is meant as an educational tool that you can use on your own time.

If you are interested in looking for a certain tree, this index contains a list of all the trees discussed and on which walks they can be found. The walks may be done in any order. While we encourage you to try them all, you can choose to do as many or as few as you like.
